PARK RESTORATION

In 2010, a group of Parkwood neighbors initiated the restoration of Parkwood Park. With a growing base of volunteer support and financial help from friends in the community, the incursion of invasive species has been arrested.

The second phase of the restoration, now underway, includes the reestablishment of a variety of species native to Georgia, the stabilization of our Peavine tributary, and the maintenance of our mature trees.

PROJECTS

PARKWOOD MEADOW

Native grasses and wildflowers will fill the sunny clearings along the West Parkwood Trail. This is an ideal home for a variety of pollinating insects and will further broaden the biodiversity of the park.

BY-PASS PLANTINGS

Mirroring the coherent design in place along W Ponce de Leon, we have plans for more native plantings along the south end of the park. Work will begin the spring 2015.

CREEK RESTORATION

The reclamation of our creek embankments from the invasive plants will begin this winter, to be followed by the introduction of additional native plants in these sensitive areas.

TREE MAINTENANCE

The management of our mature urban forest requires ongoing care for existing trees and the periodic response to dying or unstable trees. Unplanned tree removals have been a significant expense over the last three years.
