#### **PREPARATION**

<u>Barricades/Permit</u> – In order to obtain a block party permit, you will need to download and complete a Block Party Permit Application from the City of Decatur website:

http://www.decaturga.com/index.aspx?page=714. Rules regarding block parties are also listed on this website. We were unable to submit online so had to email the form directly to Police Captain David Hipple (David.Hipple@decaturga.com). Once you have a permit, you can contact Tony Kemp (Engineering Department) at 404-557-3671 to check on the availability of barricades or traffic cones, and to arrange delivery. They will typically deliver one day before the party and pick up one day after. We blocked off Upland Road from East Parkwood to Parkwood Lane.

<u>Fire Truck</u> – Contact the fire chief, explain that we're having our block party, and ask if a truck can come by. They came around 4 pm this year. We suggest asking if they can come later next year (e.g., 5 pm) so people are there and food is out (and firefighters can get a meal out of it too.)

#### **FOOD**

**BBQ** (for the BBQ cook off) – We purchased 7 butts that were approximately 5 – 6 pounds each. I recommend the Publix in Toco Hills – if you call ahead, they will have them ready. We picked up the butts on Wednesday afternoon and distributed them Wednesday and Thursday as most people needed a few days to brine, prep, etc. We purchased extra buns because we expected people to make sandwiches – you don't need them.

<u>Burgers/Hot Dogs/Buns</u> – We purchased 36 burgers and 32 beef hot dogs – we only cooked half of that and there were leftovers. We purchased these in case there were people who didn't eat pork however, there we so many sides that we really didn't need them. Would seriously consider adding one more butt or buying larger butts and nixing the burgers/dogs next year.

<u>Drinks</u> – We purchased one 12-pack each of Coke, Diet Coke, Sprite, 36 bottles of water and three 10-packs of Capri Suns. The water and juice were all gone – there were a number of kids looking for more of each. Most of the soft drinks were left untouched. From what we understand, this was the case last year as well so perhaps consider skipping the soft drinks and purchasing more juice/water (or perhaps even a few 12-packs of beer?) next year.

<u>Other food</u> – In our email communications, we asked everyone to bring a side or dessert to share. You could consider distributing this by last name (A-G bring side, H-M bring dessert, N-Z bring drinks) or something? But it turned out fine without specifying – there was plenty of food to go around!

### **Supplies**

Bubbles/Chalk – We purchased two packs of Halloween bubbles (20 each), one pack of chalk, and had some leftover. These will be stored in the Parkwood Garden Club storage bin at Katy and Dan Mallory's home. Please contact Katy at <a href="mailto:katy.mallory@gmail.com">katy.mallory@gmail.com</a> to arrange pick-up.

Candy Corns – Decoration isn't really necessary for this party but we decided to purchase 3 bags of candy corn to put in plastic cups on the tables. This was actually a big hit! We didn't have any leftover and it helped to hold the tablecloths down when wind was blowing. We would recommend this as an easy and cheap way to bring some Halloween flare to the party!

Tablecloths – We purchased 12 tablecloths for the party this year based on previous institutional memory regarding # of tables. This was too many. The Garden Club has 3 large rectangle tables that are perfect for serving food. In addition, we asked around for neighbors to bring card tables, etc...ended up with 10 total. The plastic tablecloths made clean-up easy and again added some Halloween décor to the party (we did orange, purple & green) but you could also borrow tablecloths from neighbors who are willing to wash afterwards.

Plates/Napkins/Flatware - We had some napkins and flatware in Garden Club tub (leftovers from previous parties). We purchased enough plates for 125 people (based on RSVPs) and this turned out fine. Would recommend checking the storage bin at Katy and Dan Mallory's home to see what paper goods are leftover before purchasing.

<u>Tables and Chairs</u> – The Garden Club tables (3) and chairs (lots!) are now being stored at the Kaegis' house (133 Upland Road). We also asked around for additional card tables to be used for people to eat on during the party. We used 3 of the long tables for the food but honestly could have used a fourth or fifth (we ran out of room & had to put the desserts on other tables).

#### **ACTIVITES**

<u>Costume Parade</u> – We asked kids to dress in costume and bring bikes/scooters/wagons decorated if they wanted for the parade. The kids loved the parade – we had them walk around Wimberly court and back down to Upland. Perhaps look at making a bigger deal next year (have them line up at E Parkwood, walk down Upland, and around the culdesac?). Brad Kaegi has also offered to set up an amplifier/ sound system next year. We would highly recommend this as you could have louder music playing for the parade (we just carried an iPod speaker as we walked) and could perhaps have him bring a microphone to help with announcements regarding parade, food, fire truck, cake walk, etc.

<u>Cake Walk</u> – The cake walk was also a blast! We asked people to bring cakes – we also provided 5 extras to make sure there were enough. In future, I would suggest asking for volunteers (similar to the BBQ cookoff) who want to bring cakes just so you know what to expect. We had no idea if we would have 5 cakes or 25. It turned out great but just a thought. Someone also suggested a growler walk for the adults next year – might want to consider that?!

**BBQ Cook-Off** - We numbered each tray of BBQ 1-7 and put out pieces of paper and pens for people to vote for their favorite. This worked well, although some trays ran out quickly so not everyone was able to taste each butt. Perhaps if you did larger (10 lb) butts, there would be enough for everyone to taste. We thought about creating some sort of trophy that could be passed around from year-to-year but didn't end up with enough funds. If you are able to save elsewhere, this could be a fun addition!

We're excited to announce a few new activities to this year's Fall Block Party. Below are details on the new activities – we welcome children of all ages to participate!

**Costume and Bike Parade** – Pull out your best costume, your bicycle and those streamers. We invite children of all ages to decorate their bicycles, put on their costumes and get ready to parade around Wimberly Court. Spectators will line up at 4:30 and parade participants will strut their stuff around the culde-sac.

**Cake-walk** – Everything is better with cake, right? That's what we thought. Here's how the cake-walk works: numbered squares are laid out on a path, with the number of squares in the path equal to the number of participants.
